MOBILIZE AND ENGAGE





Outreach

The Board of Directors went on the road for 12 outreach events at district meetings and at other stakeholder meetings around Ontario. Members and stakeholders were engaged in critical conversations about opportunities to mobilize and amplify the PT voice within their communities.



Home Care and Hospital Advisory Committees Joint Meeting

13 members participated in a day long strategic session to learn about integrated models of care, and how to build strategies to influence health care conversations and advocate for access to physiotherapy.



PHC Connect

31 physiotherapists practicing in primary health care participated in a full day of learning and discussion highlighting key issues in the sector related to technology, evolving interprofessional practice, mental health and driving policy change through data collection.



Member Volunteers

Volunteers promoted the physiotherapy profession at multiple events - from the Durham Children's Aid Society Wellness Day, and the Martingrove Collegiate Career Day to exhibiting at five different health care conferences throughout the year.

MOBILIZE AND ENGAGE



OPA District Events

OPA districts organized local events connecting their members.

- Education events included a PT Panel Discussion Night in London District, a new Speaker Series in Quinte St. Lawrence District, and Windsor District's Annual General Meeting including a presentation on considerations when dealing with MS. Northwestern Ontario District welcomed members to their Annual General Meeting.
- ➤ Social events brought Westgate District members together for a Physiotherapy Foundation of Canada (PFC) Beach Volleyball fundraiser with 5 teams participating raising \$500. Niagara District hosted several socials including a wine tasting and dinner, and an annual Christmas party.

National Physiotherapy Month - May 2018

Over 130 members accessed OPA resources to promote their profession for National Physiotherapy Month displaying OPA banners, brochures and swag. Kitchener-Waterloo District exhibited at The Arthritis Walk and Northwestern Ontario District awarded 3 \$50 prizes for contest winners who promoted the profession throughout the month in their respective workplaces. Windsor District exhibited at Hôtel-Dieu Grace Healthcare with videos displayed of this year's marketing campaign and participated in a shoe drive "Donate Your Kicks" for the inpatient rehab setting with approximately 80 pairs of shoes being donated overall.




2018 Flection

OPA developed tools and resources for members to engage on issues impacting physiotherapy in the 2018 election. Over 66 members reported engaging in activities and many directly shared key messages regarding access to physiotherapy and scope of practice with their MPP.

OPA Leading

OPA took the lead in engaging the Ministry and HQO teams working on the MSK Strategy and Implementation of the Rapid Assessment Clinics/Central Intake Assessment Clinics by providing education and tools, including circulating job listings in this area which helped members engage in these opportunities.



OPA Engaging to Increase Access to Care

Consulted by the Ontario Palliative Care Network in the development of physiotherapist competencies for palliative care sector

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Provided webinars and resources developed collaboratively with the Ministry and HQO to help members participate in Bundled Funding Model for Hip/Knee replacement surgery

Met with the Opposition Health Critic on the implementation of remaining scope of practice changes and access to physiotherapy

Met with the Policy Advisory to Minister of Finance on Auto Insurance Reform Collaborated with the Alliance for Healthier Communities, Association of Family Health Teams of Ontario, Nurse Practitioner Association of Ontario and 8 health professions to address recruitment and retention issues for health professionals in primary health care

Collaborated with CPA and Sports Physiotherapy Canada to respond to the Rowan's Law consultation advocating for inclusion of physiotherapists in the list of providers who assess and manage concussion and safe return to sport recommendations

INCREASE ACCESS TO CARE



Research

OPA was proud to be a part of a University of Toronto MScPT research team and the resulting article "Integrating Physiotherapists into Primary Health Care Organizations: The Physiotherapists' Perspective" was published in Physiotherapy Canada in 2018.

Marketing Campaign

OPA's multi-platform marketing campaign increased the public's knowledge and consideration for physiotherapy from April to December. Ads on Facebook, YouTube and Google led 108,000 visitors to discoverphysiotherapy.ca where they could learn more about the benefits of physiotherapy resulting in more than 10,000 searches for a physiotherapist on OPA's Find-a-Physiotherapist tool in the nine months of the campaign.

InterACTION 2018

Over 300 registrants, 24 volunteers, 29 exhibitors and 11 sponsors participated in 28 sessions and 25 poster presentations all packed into 2 days of learning, networking and celebrating.













Wound Care Management Program









OPA's Wound Care Management Program was rebranded and relaunched in 2018. All 4 components of the program were offered with over 100 participants learning new skills in this area.

District Courses

- The Eastern Ontario District (EOD) brought many members together to expand their skill set and knowledge at five different courses. EOD also co-hosted a course with the Central Toronto District.
- The Niagara District hosted two APTEI courses and the Westgate District welcomed members from its district for the Athletic Movement Assessment Lower Extremity course.

OPA Education Committee

The Education Committee accepted 3 new committee members as their mandate expanded to increase offerings and collaborations in professional development.

Research Support



Dr. Caitlin McArthur

OPA values evidence-based practice and research that advances the profession and supports health system innovation. In 2018 we supported the recruitment of participants for 14 studies and wrote 3 letters of support for research grants and participated as a member of an advisory committee for research into the use of diagnostic imaging.

In 2018 the Physiotherapy

Foundation of Canada Awarded the *Ontario Physiotherapy* Association Kim Wolny Research Grant (\$20,000) to Dr. Caitlin McArthur for her study: ABLE - Portable technology to promote exercise in the homes of frail, older adults: a pilot study.

Curated Content

Weekly curated stories from around the web about the benefits of physiotherapy, advances in the profession and timely news stories about physiotherapy were shared on Facebook. The posts resulted in more than 10,000 clicks to read the articles, 1,000 shares to Facebook friends, and 5,000 likes & loves Facebook reactions.

- London District awarded the 2018 OPA London Book Prize to the top Western MPT group research paper to Casey D'Mello, Dennis Dumphy, Aleksander Kravic, and Aya Mohammed.
- Westgate, Northern and Eastern Ontario Districts awarded bursaries to their local members to attend InterACTION 2018.
- The Central Toronto District Student Award was awarded to Christiane Junod and Sawyer Peloso. The Central Toronto District MScPT Student Research Grant for Class of 2018 received 8 applicants and was awarded to the research titled "What are the perspectives of experts regarding barriers to and opportunities for increasing the recruitment of Black students into Canadian physiotherapy programs?"


Practice Communities on Ignite

New to Practice

OPA engaged a recent PT graduate to support initiatives to increase new to practice members. Additional resources and engagement opportunities were offered on the platform resulting in a 38% growth of participation.

OPA continued to promote and offer online community space for physiotherapists practicing in primary health care and in community physiotherapy clinics with two separate private groups for each.



VALUE FOR MEMBERSHIP



Engaging from Day 1 – OPA and Students

- 220 students from all five Ontario universities participated in OPA's National Examination Information Sessions.
- ▶ OPA presented as part of the curriculum for students to all five Ontario university programs.
- OPA presented to the OIEBP classes during their first and final residency weeks.
- OPA Practice, Policy and Member Services team received a recognition award from the University of Toronto, MScPT program for their contribution to student learning.
- Student education clinical placement:
 - OPA hosted a second year student from the University of Toronto Physical Therapy program for their final clinical placement in the Practice, Policy and Member services department. The student said "A non-clinical placement such as at OPA is an effective way to prepare yourself to advocate for positive change within the health system".
 - A first year student from McMaster worked with OPA and the PCAC to help organize PHC Connect. The student indicated that this placement was a great change of pace from regular clinical placements and that there was a lot of opportunity for collaboration and team discussions.
- 303 New Grad toolkits were mailed to New Graduate members.

Districts Engaging Students

York Region Scarborough District hosted a student engagement event. The District also co-hosted an annual student event with the Central Toronto District featuring a panel of 6 physiotherapists speaking about their fields of practice.

The Central Toronto District students volunteered with two physiotherapists at the GoodLife Marathon, and the U of T class of 2020 enjoyed a presentation from OPA Board member Courtney Bean and CTD President Michelle Duong.



The Eastern Ontario District hosted two events for uOttawa students tailoring each event with one for 1st year students and one for 2nd years.



The Niagara District successfully launched their Instagram account, geared towards new graduates in the profession, to disseminate information about district events and increase membership.
